Celebrating Catholic Schools Week



3rd quarter is in full swing in 3rd grade! We enjoyed Christmas break and came back ready to learn. During our first week back, we read the book One Word. This book is all about picking one word to be your goal for the year. After we read the book, each student picked their one word, wrote why they picked that word and then made a bracelet with that word using letter beads. By creating a bracelet, the students will always be able to remember their word or even be able to tell someone about their words if they are asked what it means.

For growth mindset, we played a game called Can the Trash talk. Each student got two different sayings. The sayings were either using growth mindset or fixed mindset. If the saying was fixed mindset, then the student had to crumble it up and throw it away! The students were really surprised with some of the saying that had to be “canned” because they were some they have said themselves not realizing they were fixed mindset sayings. We want to always use positive self-talk, words and phrases that help us grow, even when things get tough.

We are still rocking our math facts in 3rd grade. Currently, 3rd grade is fluent in 1, 950 math fact!! I cannot wait to see what the next few months have in store for us and all the growth they will make.
